Tips to Get the Brand Name Your Doctor Prescribed



Some pharmacies may fill a branded prescription with a generic medication and may not be required to notify you.

Follow the steps below to help ensure you receive the brand-name CELEBREX your doctor prescribed. Eligible, commercially-insured patients may be able to save on their prescription.[†]

AT THE DOCTOR'S OFFICE

 Ask your doctor to indicate "DAW" (Dispense As Written), if appropriate, on all your CELEBREX prescriptions to ensure you're receiving the same medication month to month.*





AT THE PHARMACY

- Eligible patients should present their CELEBREX Savings Card to the pharmacist. Remember that the CELEBREX Savings Card only works with brand-name CELEBREX.
- If you would like to remain on brand-name CELEBREX, inform your pharmacist and ask to note your preference for brand name for future fills.

WHEN PICKING UP YOUR PRESCRIPTION

- Check your pills to make sure the shape and distinctive markings match one of the pills pictured.
- Notify the pharmacist right away if you did not receive brand-name CELEBREX.
